## **Security Screening & Traveling with Medications**



Advance planning now can make your travel much more pleasant. One of the many things to plan is traveling with liquids and medications. All passenger items must undergo security screening and these tips will help you make the screening process go more smoothly.

### **Traveling with Liquids**



You are allowed to bring a quart-sized bag of liquids, aerosols, gels, creams and pastes in your carry-on bag and through the checkpoint. These are limited to travel-sized containers that are 3.4 ounces (100 milliliters) or less per item. Placing these items in the small bag and separating from your carry-on baggage facilitates the screening process. Pack items that are in containers larger than 3.4 ounces or 100 milliliters in checked baggage.

Any liquid, aerosol, gel, cream or paste that alarms during screening will require additional screening.

### **Traveling with Medications**

TSA does not require passengers to have medications in original prescription bottles, but states have individual laws that may require that your medications be in their original containers when transporting them within your state (to/from the airport). If you do not bring your medications in their original containers, it is recommended that you travel with a list of medications you take.
