Dr. Brandon A. Boyd enjoys a versatile career as a conductor, in addition to appearing regularly as a composer-in-residence, collaborative pianist, and presenter for conferences, conventions, collegiate choirs, church choirs, choral symposiums, and festivals. He is the Director of Choral Activities and Associate Professor of Choral Music Education at the University of Missouri, where he conducts MU University Singers and Choral Union. In addition to his conducting duties at the university, he teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in choral conducting and choral music education.

As a global collaborator in the orchestral world, Dr. Boyd has served as chorus master, assistant conductor, and guest pianist with the London Symphony in London, England. He prepared the NDR Elbphilharmonie Orchestra and Vokalensemble for Maestro Alan Gilbert for multiple productions of Gershwin's Porgy and Bess, in Hamburg and Kiel, Germany. In the U.S., he has guest conducted the Nashville Symphony, Missouri Symphony, and the St. Louis Symphony. He has made multiple performances at Carnegie in the capacity of guest conductor, composer, and collaborative pianist.

Dr. Boyd served as Santa Fe Desert Chorale's Composer-in-Residence and Community Engagement Leader for their program Giving Voice to the Voiceless. The Chorale premiered a work commissioned by the SFDC, I Search, during their 35th Anniversary of the Summer Justice Concert Series. He holds two degrees from Florida State University (Ph.D. in choral music education and M.M. in choral conducting) and earned a B.S. in music education (emphasis in piano) from Tennessee State University.

Tour Itinerary

Day 1 - Wednesday, June 4, 2025 - Departure USA

The journey to Italy begins by boarding an international flight to Rome.

Day 2 - Thursday, June 5, 2025 - Arrival Rome

Arrive in Rome. Time permitting take a walking tour of the city's ancient center with your tour manager. Welcome dinner and overnight in Rome.

Day 3 - Friday, June 6, 2025 - Vatican Sightseeing & Rehearsal

This morning visit the Vatican Museum and St. Peter's Basilica. After lunch transfer to Tuscany for a first rehearsal, dinner and overnight.

Day 4 - Saturday, June 7, 2025 - Rehearsals & City Sightseeing

Start the day with a joint rehearsal followed by a guided tour of Florence incl. a visit to the majestic Duomo. Some time at leisure before an evening rehearsal with Dr. Boyd. Overnight in Tuscany.

Day 5 - Sunday, June 8, 2025 - Dress Rehearsal & Gala Concert

Relax this morning in preparation for tonight's gala concert. This afternoon, dress rehearsal in the festival concert venue. Dr. Boyd will lead the combined chorus in a glorious celebration of transformative music during tonight's festival concert. Dinner and overnight in Tuscany.

Day 6 - Monday, June 9, 2025 - Depart Tuscany / Start Post Festival Tour Programs

Morning transfer to the airport for your return flight to the USA or start your post festival tour program.

Pre/Post Festival Tour Programs

Optional pre- and post-tours for groups of 20 and more passengers are available including additional individual performance opportunities for balanced ensembles. All of Pl's pre/ post tours are fully customized to each choir's specific needs. Following are some examples:

Tour B

Transfer to Venice with a stop en route in Pisa to see the Leaning Tower. Spend two nights in the "City of Canals" and enjoy a guided walking tour including a visit to St. Mark's Basilica, the city's Byzantine masterpiece.
